We have conducted a compliance audit of the Treasurer, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania (County Officer), for the license periods identified on the contents page, pursuant to the requirements of Section 401(d) of *The Fiscal Code*, 72 P.S. § 401(d).

The objective of the audit was to determine whether all moneys collected on behalf of the Commonwealth have been correctly assessed, reported, and promptly remitted and to provide a report to the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Fish and Boat Commission, and the Department of Agriculture. Our audit was limited to areas related to the objective identified above and was not conducted, nor was it required to be, in accordance with Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

The County Officer is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal controls to provide reasonable assurance of compliance with state laws and regulations applicable to the collection of moneys on behalf of the Commonwealth, including whether they have been correctly assessed, reported, and promptly remitted. The County Officer is also responsible for complying with those laws and regulations. It is our responsibility to perform procedures to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to the extent necessary to satisfy the audit objective. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our conclusions.

Based on our audit procedures, we conclude that, for the license periods identified on the contents page, the County Officer, in all significant respects, complied with state laws and regulations applicable to the collection of moneys on behalf of the Commonwealth, including whether they have been correctly assessed, reported, and promptly remitted, except as noted in the finding listed below and discussed later in this report:

Missing Dog Licenses.

This report includes summaries of the County Officer's receipts and disbursements of funds collected on behalf of the Commonwealth (summaries). We obtained data representing the County Officer's receipts and disbursements from the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Fish and Boat Commission, and the Department of Agriculture, which obtains data from each of the Commonwealth's treasurer offices and used the data to create the summaries. We also evaluated the accuracy of the data as part of our audit to conclude on the County Officer's compliance with certain state laws and regulations as described in the previous paragraph. Any adjustments that we considered necessary based on our audit work are disclosed in the *Audit Adjustments* line of the summaries; however, the scope of our audit does not include the issuance of an opinion on the accuracy of the amounts reported in the summaries.

The purpose of this report is to determine whether all moneys collected on behalf of the Commonwealth have been correctly assessed, reported, and promptly remitted. This report is not suitable for any other purposes.

TREASURER HUNTINGDON COUNTY BACKGROUND

FOR THE HUNTING LICENSE PERIOD JULY 1, 2018 TO JUNE 30, 2022 AND FOR THE FISHING AND DOG LICENSE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2019 TO DECEMBER 31, 2022

The Department of Auditor General is mandated by Article IV, Section 401 (d) of *The Fiscal Code* (Act of April 9, 1929, P.L.343, No. 176), to audit the accounts of each county officer to determine whether all moneys collected on behalf of the Commonwealth have been correctly assessed, reported, and promptly remitted.

Treasurer receipts consist of monies collected on behalf of the licensing agency.

The proceeds from the sale of hunting licenses, sold electronically, for license years 2018 through 2021 were remitted weekly through an electronic funds transfer program.

The proceeds from the sale of fishing licenses, sold electronically, for license years 2019 through 2022 were remitted weekly through an electronic funds transfer program.

The proceeds from the sale of dog licenses for the license years 2019 through 2022 were remitted by check to the appropriate licensing agency with the monthly reports of sales.

The following schedule identifies the licensing agencies and the respective reporting period:

<u>License Type</u>	Licensing Agency	<u>License Period</u>
Hunting	Game Commission	July 1 to June 30
Fishing	Fish and Boat Commission	January 1 to December 31
Dog	Department of Agriculture	January 1 to December 31

With all the license types listed above, there are licenses that are sold the month prior to the official license period beginning date. For our reporting purposes, these sales are included in the official first month of the license period. The balances reflect the summary of monthly sales reports as settled by the appropriate licensing agency.

Susan Harry served as Treasurer during the hunting license period July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2022, and during the fishing and dog license period January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2022.

The summaries of receipts and disbursements provide a summary of receipts and disbursements by category. The categories and the costs of licenses are based on Pennsylvania laws and regulations.

The summaries were prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the licensing agencies. Under this method, only the Commonwealth portion of cash receipts and disbursements are presented, revenues are recognized when received, and expenditures are recognized when paid.

FINDING AND RECOMMENDATIONS

FOR THE HUNTING LICENSE PERIOD JULY 1, 2018 TO JUNE 30, 2022 AND FOR THE FISHING AND DOG LICENSE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2019 TO DECEMBER 31, 2022

Finding - Missing Dog Licenses

Our audit disclosed that the following records could not be located and were unavailable for review:

- 2,500 Individual dog licenses and tags totaling \$17,500 for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.
- 800 Senior dog licenses and tags totaling \$4,000 for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

Good internal accounting controls ensure that all records are properly accounted for and maintained. In addition, all documentation should be kept until audited by the Department of the Auditor General.

The office holder stated that she placed the treasurer's allotted amount of licenses and tags for 2020 on the floor against a wall between the clerk's desk and the counter. What she did not take into consideration was that this area has a trash recycle bin located there. She did not have identifying labels on the boxes. She also stated that the boxes must have been assumed to be trash. She contacted the night custodian. He does not remember throwing them away but stated that must have been what happened.

Without a good system of internal controls over record retention, the potential for fraud or misappropriation is increased.

Recommendations

We recommend that the office establish and implement procedures to ensure that all records are properly accounted for and maintained. In addition, all documentation should be kept until audited by the Department of the Auditor General.

Finding - Missing Dog Licenses (Continued)

Management's Response

The County Officer responded as follows:

My office acknowledges that the 2020 annual dog licenses allotted to the Huntingdon County Treasurer's office were removed and destroyed in error by a custodian. The licenses were in boxes and assumed by the cleaning staff that they were to be removed (the outside dog agents' licenses had already been distributed at that time). The specific employee from the custodian staff is no longer an employee of the county.

When this occurred, both [Individual 1] and [Individual 2] were notified by telephone and was followed up with an email. We had enough licenses in our supply to continue to sell without any new licenses needing to be issued to us by Dog Law.

Auditor's Conclusion

We appreciate the current officeholder's effort to correct this issue. It is imperative that internal controls are in place to safeguard Commonwealth assets. During our next audit, we will determine if the office complied with our recommendations.
