Dear Mr. Potteiger and Mrs. Huhn:

We conducted a Limited Procedures Engagement (LPE) of the Brandywine Heights Area School District (District) to determine its compliance with certain relevant state laws, regulations, policies, and administrative procedures (relevant requirements). The LPE covers the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2016, except for any areas of compliance that may have required an alternative to this period. The engagement was conducted pursuant to authority derived from Article VIII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 402 and 403), but was not conducted in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

As we conducted our LPE procedures, we sought to determine answers to the following questions, which serve as our LPE objectives:

- Did the District have documented board policies and administrative procedures related to the following?
 - Internal controls
 - o Budgeting practices
 - o The Right-to-Know Law
 - o The Sunshine Act
- Were the policies and procedures adequate and appropriate, and have they been properly implemented?
- Did the District comply with the relevant requirements in the Right-to-Know Law and the Sunshine Act?
- Did the District take appropriate corrective action to address the finding made in our prior audit?


The following table and charts consist of School Performance Profile (SPP) scores and Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) results for the entire District obtained from PDE's data files. These scores are presented in the District's audit report for **informational purposes only**, and they were not audited by our Department.


SPP benchmarks represent the statewide average of all district school buildings in the Commonwealth.² PSSA benchmarks and goals are determined by PDE each school year and apply to all public school entities.³ District SPP and PSSA scores were calculated using an average of all of the individual school buildings within the District. Scores below SPP statewide averages and PSSA benchmarks/goals are presented in red.

² Statewide averages for SPP scores were calculated based on all district school buildings throughout the Commonwealth, excluding charter and cyber charter schools.

³ PSSA benchmarks apply to all district school buildings, charters, and cyber charters. In the 2011-12 school year, the state benchmarks reflect the Adequate Yearly Progress targets established under No Child Left Behind. In the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school years, the state benchmarks reflect the statewide goals based on annual measurable objectives established by PDE.

⁴ The following letter grades are based on a 0-100 point system: A (90-100), B (80-89), C (70-79), D (60-69), F (59 or below).



4 Year Cohort Graduation Rates

The cohort graduation rates are a calculation of the percentage of students who have graduated with a regular high school diploma within a designated number of years since the student first entered high school. The rate is determined for a cohort of students who have all entered high school for the first time during the same school year.⁶

Status of Prior Audit Findings and Observations

ur prior audit of the District released on April 3, 2014, resulted in one finding, as shown below. As part of our current engagement, we determined the status of corrective action taken by the District to implement our prior audit recommendations. We interviewed District personnel and performed audit procedures as detailed in the status section below.

Auditor General Performance Audit Report Released on April 3, 2014

Prior Finding: Certification Deficiency

Prior Finding Summary: Our prior audit of the District found that a guidance counselor was employed on a certificate that had lapsed at the end of the first semester of the 2012-13 school year. The employee served in this position beginning in February 2007 while holding a Level I Professional certificate. A Level II Permanent certificate was not received until September 2013.

Prior Recommendations: We recommended that the District should:

- 1. Strengthen controls to help ensure that individuals' certificates are kept current.
- 2. Monitor years of service for all provisionally certified employees.
- 3. Develop procedures to determine that applications for permanent certificates have been received by the PDE.

We also recommended that PDE should:

4. Adjust the District's allocations to recover the subsidy forfeiture of \$1,600.

Current Status:

We found the District did implement our prior recommendations. The District strengthened controls to ensure that certificates are current by monitoring years of service for all certified employees and comparing years of service to job descriptions. Also, the District developed procedures to ensure that applications for permanent certificates are received by PDE and now tracks this information. PDE also implemented our prior recommendation by withholding the District's subsidy forfeiture of \$1,600 on December 24, 2014.
