Dear Dr. DiNinno and Dr. McClure:

We conducted a Limited Procedures Engagement (LPE) of the Riverview School District (District) to determine its compliance with certain relevant state laws, regulations, policies, and administrative procedures (relevant requirements). The LPE covers the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015, except for any areas of compliance that may have required an alternative to this period. The engagement was conducted pursuant to authority derived from Article VIII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 402 and 403), but was not conducted in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

As we conducted our LPE procedures, we sought to determine answers to the following questions, which serve as our LPE objectives:

- Did the District have documented board policies and administrative procedures related to the following?
 - Internal controls
 - o Budgeting practices
 - o The Right-to-Know Law
 - o The Sunshine Act
- Were the policies and procedures adequate and appropriate, and have they been properly implemented?
- Did the District comply with the relevant requirements in the Right-to-Know Law and the Sunshine Act?
- Did the District take appropriate corrective action to address the observation made in our prior audit?



These scores are presented in the District's audit report for **informational purposes only**, and they were not audited by our Department.


SPP benchmarks represent the statewide average of all district school buildings in the Commonwealth.² PSSA benchmarks and goals are determined by PDE each school year and apply to all public school entities.³ District SPP and PSSA scores were calculated using an average of all of the individual school buildings within the District. Scores below SPP statewide averages and PSSA benchmarks/goals are presented in red.

³ PSSA benchmarks apply to all district school buildings, charters, and cyber charters. In the 2011-12 school year, the state benchmarks reflect the Adequate Yearly Progress targets established under No Child Left Behind. In the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school years, the state benchmarks reflect the statewide goals based on annual measurable objectives established by PDE.



4 Year Cohort Graduation Rates

The cohort graduation rates are a calculation of the percentage of students who have graduated with a regular high school diploma within a designated number of years since the student first entered high school. The rate is determined for a cohort of students who have all entered high school for the first time during the same school year.⁶

Status of Prior Audit Findings and Observations

Our prior audit of the District released on December 2, 2013, resulted in one observation, as shown below. As part of our current engagement, we determined the status of corrective action taken by the District to implement our prior audit recommendations. We reviewed the District's written response provided to PDE, interviewed District personnel, and performed audit procedures as detailed in each status section below.

Auditor General Performance Audit Report Released on December 2, 2013

Prior Observation: Amount Paid Pupil Transportation Contractor Greatly Exceeds
Pennsylvania Department of Education Final Formula Allowance

Prior Observation
Summary:

Our prior audit of the District's transportation costs for the 2008-09 through 2011-12 school years found, over that four year period, the District paid its main transportation contractor substantially more than PDE's final formula allowance, which is used to determine reimbursement of pupil transportation services.

<u>Prior Recommendations:</u> We recommended that the District should:

- 1. Ensure that, prior to negotiating a new contract, the Board of School Directors and administrative personnel are cognizant of the state's final formula allowance cost formula.
- 2. Routinely seek competitive bids for all of the District's pupil transportation services to ensure the most efficient cost to the District and its taxpayers.
- 3. Prepare pupil transportation contracts to ensure local share is as minimal as possible by establishing the base rate and increases in line with PDE's final formula allowance for all pupil transportation costs.
- 4. Have District personnel continuously monitor and justify any increase in the District's pupil transportation costs.

Current Status:

The District solicited Request for Proposals for student transportation services prior to the previous contract expiring. A new contractor was selected after all the Requests for Proposals were considered and this contractor began providing transportation services to the District in the 2014-15 school year. The new five-year contract for student transportation services considered the formula allowance and will

for implementing our prior recommendations.
