Dear Dr. Scanlon and Mr. McCune:

We conducted a Limited Procedures Engagement (LPE) of the West Chester Area School District (District) to determine its compliance with certain relevant state laws, regulations, policies, and administrative procedures (relevant requirements). The LPE covers the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015, except for any areas of compliance that may have required an alternative to this period. The engagement was conducted pursuant to authority derived from Article VIII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 402 and 403), but was not conducted in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

As we conducted our LPE procedures, we sought to determine answers to the following questions, which serve as our LPE objectives:

- Did the District have documented board policies and administrative procedures related to the following?
  - o Internal controls
  - Budgeting practices
  - o The Right-to-Know Law
  - o The Sunshine Act
- Were the policies and procedures adequate and appropriate, and have they been properly implemented?
- Did the District comply with the relevant requirements in the Right-to-Know Law and the Sunshine Act?
- Did the District take appropriate corrective action to address the finding made in our prior audit?


# **Academic Information**


The following table and charts consist of School Performance Profile (SPP) scores and Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) results for the entire District obtained from PDE's data files. These scores are presented in the District's audit report for **informational purposes only**, and they were not audited by our Department.


SPP benchmarks represent the statewide average of all district school buildings in the Commonwealth.<sup>2</sup> PSSA benchmarks and goals are determined by PDE each school year and apply to all public school entities.<sup>3</sup> District SPP and PSSA scores were calculated using an average of all of the individual school buildings within the District. Scores below SPP statewide averages and PSSA benchmarks/goals are presented in red.



# **4 Year Cohort Graduation Rates**

The cohort graduation rates are a calculation of the percentage of students who have graduated with a regular high school diploma within a designated number of years since the student first entered high school. The rate is determined for a cohort of students who have all entered high school for the first time during the same school year.<sup>6</sup>

# **Status of Prior Audit Findings and Observations**

ur prior audit of the District released on October 24, 2013, resulted in one finding as shown below. As part of our current engagement, we determined the status of corrective action taken by the District to implement our prior audit recommendations. We interviewed District personnel and performed audit procedures as detailed in the status section below.

# Auditor General Performance Audit Report Released on October 24, 2013

### **Prior Finding: Certification Deficiencies**

Prior Finding Summary: Our prior audit review of the District's professional employees' certification for the period August 4, 2009, through March 28, 2012, found nine professional employees were teaching with lapsed certificates. These nine professional employees served in positions of elementary guidance counselor, biology teacher, speech correction teacher, special education teacher, physics teacher, English teacher, elementary teachers, and secondary guidance counselor. The District was assessed subsidy forfeitures attributable to the 2009-10 through the 2011-12 school years of \$78,767.

Prior Recommendations: We recommended that the District should:

- 1. Take the necessary action required to ensure compliance with certification regulations.
- 2. Implement procedures to track years of service for all individuals who are not permanently certified.

We also recommended that PDE should:

3. Adjust the District's allocations to assess the appropriate subsidy forfeitures.

# **Current Status:**

We found the District did implement our prior recommendations. The District took the necessary action required to ensure compliance with certification regulations. They put procedures in place to track years of service for all individuals who are not permanently certified. As a result, the nine individuals cited in our prior audit now are properly certified for their positions. PDE did withhold the subsidy forfeitures of \$78,767 on December 24, 2014.
